ABOUT OUR THEATRE

Little Theatre Off Broadway (LTOB) initially performed at area schools a few blocks away from Grove City's Broadway before finding a home in the current, 92-seat theatre. One of the oldest community theatres in Ohio, LTOB currently offers six productions a season and is run completely by volunteers.

The current theatre, formerly the Douglas movie theatre, was renovated in 1966 and has been the home of LTOB since that time. Surviving a fire that gutted the building in 1978 and a renovation in 2002, the theatre has been going strong for over six decades.

The theatre has staged a variety of productions since its establishment. Shows continue to win regional recognition, and LTOB is well known in the Ohio Community Theatre Association (OCTA).

I hope you see in the Turpins the love in their hearts despite their conflicts, and that they truly care for each other, no matter what comes into – or out of – their lives.
